Global ID Policy 1

This policy is available in <u>Arabic</u>, <u>French</u>, <u>German</u>, <u>Korean</u>, <u>Portuguese</u>, <u>Simplified Chinese</u>, and <u>Spanish</u>. If you are testing in Japan, refer to <u>this policy</u> instead.

ID requirements

If your exam sponsor follows Global ID Policy 1, you must bring one primary ID to the test center:

- The ID must have your first and last name; a recent, recognizable photo; and your signature. The first and last name on the ID must match the first and last name you used to register for the exam.
- The ID must be original (not a photocopy or digital ID), valid (unexpired), and government issued.

Note: Expired IDs are acceptable if accompanied by renewal paperwork.

• The ID must be issued from the country in which you are testing (except for EU cards, which are acceptable in any country within the EU Zone).

Note: If you do not have a primary ID from the country in which you are testing, you must bring an international travel passport. The passport must be issued from your country of citizenship, and the information on the passport must be in Roman characters.

Examples of acceptable IDs

- International travel passport
- Driver's license
- Military ID (includes spouse and dependents)
- Identification card (national/state/province ID card)
- Alien registration card (green card/permanent resident/visa)
- Government-issued local language ID (i.e., not in Roman characters)

Note: Government-issued local language IDs are not acceptable outside the country from which the ID was issued.
